Total Items: 980

Formats: Books, CDs, DVDs, software, instructional guides (including book and audio CD), kits (such as flash cards), and pronunciation tools.

Collection: The Literacy/English Language Development materials are organized by categories including a *Citizenship Corner*; *Dictionaries/Idioms*; *Grammar/Pronunciation*; *Jobs*; *Language/Teaching/Tutoring*; *Life Skills*; *Reading*; *Stories*; and *Tests*.

Availability: All items available for interlibrary loan.

Computers: Two standalone computers in the Literacy/English Language Development Room dedicated to ESL learning and basic reading for adults; no reservations are required; and the literacy computers (including software and Lisle Library Literacy websites links, <http://www.lislelibrary.org/literacy/literacy-sites>) are available to any adults who need literacy/ESL help.

Tutoring space: Several group meeting rooms can house two one-to-one groups at a time. Also, the Literacy/ELD Room includes two computers and space for one-to-one or small group tutoring (located in the center of the Library between the fiction and nonfiction areas). No reservations are required to tutor or study in the new Literacy Room; however, to secure regularly scheduled tutoring space in the Literacy/ELD Room week to week, reservations are encouraged by contacting Jean Demas, Literacy Outreach Librarian, literacy@lislelibrary.org or 630-971-1675, x1002 .
